But as times and customer habits change, so too are we reimagining a modern and vibrant town centre with the right mix of retail, hospitality, leisure, and new homes.


This is an exciting time for Bolton with a number of major regeneration projects already delivered and many more to come in the near future.

Opening in Spring 2024, the hall will be a bustling hospitality venue serving hungry shoppers, busy office workers, local university and college students and crowds of theatregoers With entertainment, live sport and later opening hours on Fridays and Saturdays, the food hall is sure to become a popular destination in its own right.

With 300,000 residents in Bolton alone, 25,000 university and college students, and millions of visitors each year, traders will not be short of potential customers.


New traders will be fully supported by the team at Bolton Market, who have an excellent track record of supporting businesses - helping them to develop, thrive and expand.

Each unit at the Bolton Market Food Hall comes equipped with:



- Free Wifi




Floor Plan

Bolton Market Food Hall is not the only new addition to the neighbourhood, as major regeneration projects continue to transform this key area of the town centre.

Across the street, your customers will have the perfect view of Elizabeth Park, a brand-new green space opening in early 2024.

Complete with seating areas, picnic tables and a public performance space, the park will be supported with an exciting programme of events and activities throughout the year.

More exciting things are happening just around the corner, as work continues to convert the Wellsprings office building into a £11.18m innovation hub for digital and creative start-ups. Many businesses and public sector organisations already have offices in the area, guaranteeing a solid week-day customer base.

Nearby Le Mans Crescent is constantly in demand as a filming location for everything from Peaky Blinders to Coronation Street.

It's not unusual to bump into a famous actor during the lunchtime rush in Bolton, not to mention the large crews and hundreds of extras that come with major productions.



Our new food hall traders will have thousands of customers on their doorstep, thanks to the ongoing regeneration that will bring 5,000 new residents to the town centre.

Among them will be Bolton Market's new next-door neighbours, moving into the 218 apartments and townhouses that form the Moor Lane development.

With the first phase due for completion in 2024, residents will benefit from new greenspaces and easy access to the market's many outstanding traders.

A short walk from there is Deansgate Gardens, where award-winning developer Placefirst is creating 167 new high-quality homes for rent.

With more modern and desirable residential developments planned across the town centre, the new residents will represent a convenient customer base for shops, leisure destinations and hospitality.




Putting your business in the spotlight

Bolton loves to perform, and the town certainly punches above its weight in terms of leading entertainment venues – and the audiences that come along with them.

The famous Octagon Theatre is just one of many cultural institutions just a short walk from Bolton Market Food Hall.

The 673-seater theatre at the historic Albert Halls has welcomed some of the biggest names in show business including Peter Kay and Sir Ian McKellen. The venue is busy all year round, hosting weddings, university graduations and the ever-popular pantomime.

In January 2024, Bolton's spectacular Central Library reopened its doors after a £4.43m renovation. Much loved by residents of all ages, the new mezzanine floor, children's area and updated digital facilities are sure to attract even more visitors to the area. The work complements the £3.8m restoration of Bolton Museum which includes one of the country's leading Egyptology collections and is enjoyed by tourists from across the UK.



Bolton knows good food

When it comes to food stalls – few places can match Bolton when it comes to enthusiastic customers.

Now in its 19th year, the annual Bolton Food and Drink Festival has grown into the biggest event of its kind in the UK and one of the biggest in Europe.

Boasting 200 traders offering a wide variety of food, drink and other goods, last year's event attracted half a million visitors and won the prestigious "Most Loved Live Event" at the 2023 I Love Manchester awards.

Our festival traders are backed up by the same team that operates Bolton Market, and the event is noted for its high retention rate – traders come back year after year because of the expertise, support, and excellent facilities.

And the festival is far from the only fixture of Bolton's events calendar. The IRONMAN weekend, Bolton Pride, Christmas Light Festival and many more means there are always plenty of hungry visitors to feed.
